JOB SUMMARY

The **Suicide Intervention Program (SIP) Counsellor** provides suicide risk assessments and assesses child/youth's general functioning, crisis intervention, and stabilization. The SIP Counsellor also provides short term supportive counselling. Although primarily individual intervention, engaging family members in the intervention plan might be necessary. Service is provided in a variety of settings including outreach.

Working as part of a team and employing an attachment-based and emotion-focused framework, the Healthy Families Program (HFP) Counsellor is responsible for an assigned caseload consisting of parents/caregivers and their families. In conjunction with the client, the HFP Counsellor conducts a comprehensive strengths and needs-based assessment, and develops and implements a comprehensive, individualized intervention plan with specified goals that address, are sensitive to, and respect the client's individual circumstances. Service delivery may occur as outreach (in clients' homes and/or other community settings) or in office-based locations and includes, but is not limited to, traditional (individual, group and family) counselling modalities, education and skills training, as well as a provision of direct assistance and support to clients in accomplishing daily tasks and advocacy on client's behalf.

Employing a cognitive-behavioural, systems, and strategic framework, the **Seniors Counsellor (SEN)** works in collaboration with the client to conduct a comprehensive strengths and needs focused assessment and develops and implements a comprehensive, holistic intervention plan

with specified goals that address, are sensitive to, and respect a client's individual circumstances. Service delivery may occur in clients' homes and/or other community settings (outreach) or in office-based locations. Services include, but is not limited to traditional (individual, group and family) counselling modalities, education/skills training, as well as provision of support to clients in facilitating referrals to help them accomplish daily tasks.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Suicide Intervention Program Counsellor

Assessment and Intervention

- Establish prompt contact with child/youth/parents upon receiving a referral
- Assess suicide risk and child/youth's general functioning and family functioning (when appropriate)
- Provide crisis intervention, stabilization and short term counselling
- Engage family members as much as feasible to intervention plan
- Facilitate referrals for longer term counselling or other resources, as needed
- For MCFD referrals, assess after 4th session and contact CYMH Team Leader to discuss next steps

Case Management

- Collaborate with referring parties and service providers to develop and implement care plans as appropriate
- Maintain and implement communication and response protocols with other suicide intervention services

Healthy Families Program Counsellor

- Provides intensive, family-centred counselling and support with the objective of assuring
 the safety of children within a parent or caregiver's home or in other safe living
 environments (i.e. extended family, foster family, etc.), by enhancing parental
 effectiveness and facilitating the empowerment of the family as the primary childrearing agent.
- Identifies and assesses existing individual and familial strengths and any issues of safety
 that would preclude a child from being maintained in their biological parent or
 caregiver's home.
- In association with the family, develops and implements individualized intervention plans based on a comprehensive assessment that identifies the family's strengths, needs, preferences, and needed supports.

- In situations where safety issues cannot be resolved, the counsellor facilitates healthy, positive, and consistent relationships with biological parents or caregivers to the extent that this is possible.
- Provides services within an ethno-cultural framework, so that the family's culture and spirituality are integrated into the service plan perspective. This may include the involvement of significant others such as elders, members of faith groups, or other persons identified by the family that play a significant cultural or spiritual role in their lives.
- Works cooperatively and collaboratively with the family and the Ministry of Children
 and Family Development (MCFD) to develop a family treatment plan that includes
 mutually agreed upon goals and objectives for the family's treatment. These goals and
 objectives will be directly related to the circumstances that led to an "at risk" status for
 the child(ren) and will:
 - 1. Address the most immediate concerns of the family and MCFD
 - 2. Reflect the family's agenda for change, including developing and facilitating links to needed internal and external resources through within the family's community in order to maintain, support, and, directly ensure the safety of the children in the home, (i.e. school, church, neighbours, elders, etc.)
- Creates and facilitates groups for children and parents/caregivers

Seniors Counsellor

- Provides intensive, client-centred counselling, outreach, and intervention
- Completes a preliminary assessment of the individual, couple or family situation
- Identifies and assesses existing family/individual strengths and, in conjunction with the client, prepares an individual treatment plan.
- Develops and implements interventions that are based on a comprehensive assessment and:
 - include concrete, realistic, achievable goals that are subject to ongoing systematic monitoring and evaluation of achievement
 - o are highly flexible in order to meet client needs
 - employ cognitive-behavioural techniques such as skill acquisition/development through training and modeling; cognitive-restructuring of dysfunctional thought patterns, attitudes and beliefs; and facilitation and support of change through direct action (e.g. accompanying, advocating and supporting clients in accessing and utilizing community resources)
